



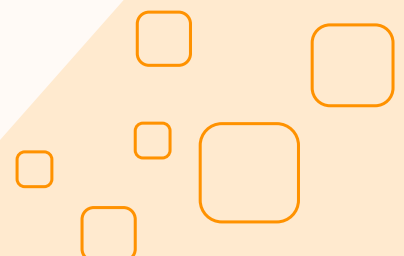

We welcome your ideas and suggestions for future editions of this newsletter.

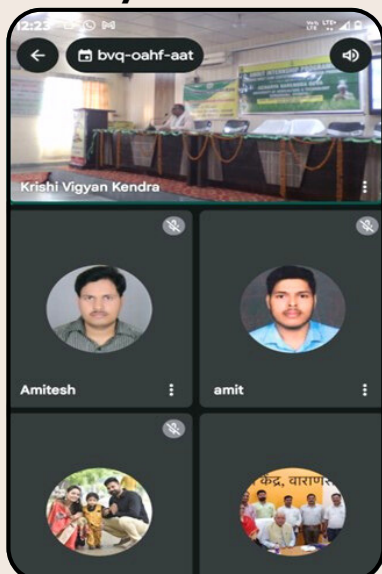
Farmers' Meet & Certificate Distribution Ceremony, Varanasi

On 2nd May, 2025 one day Farmers Meet cum Certificate Distribution Programme for Amrit Interns was organized at Krishi Vigyan Kendra, Varanasi. A total of 59 students from various institutes and universities across the states participated both physically and virtually.

The inaugural session commenced with a welcome address by Dr. Naveen Kumar Singh, Senior Scientist & Head, KVK. Mr. Kamlesh Singh, SAC Board Member and Champion Farmer, highlighted the significance of Natural Farming. Dr. Rishi Pal Singh, Mentor, IPL Foundation, joined virtually to provide insights into rural realities and shared key steps undertaken during the internship. Mrs. Sonika Rana, DDM-NABARD, Varanasi, emphasized ICRO's efforts, the value of authentic farmer data, and encouraged students to collaborate with farmers to contribute toward a developed India by 2047.



In the technical session, Mr. S.P. Singh, SMS-Seed Technology, discussed millets and natural farming. Dr. Amitesh Kumar Singh, SMS-Agronomy, shared knowledge on IPM in Rabi crops, while Dr. Pooja Singh, SMS-Animal Science, elaborated on Integrated Farming Systems for sustainable agriculture and steady income. 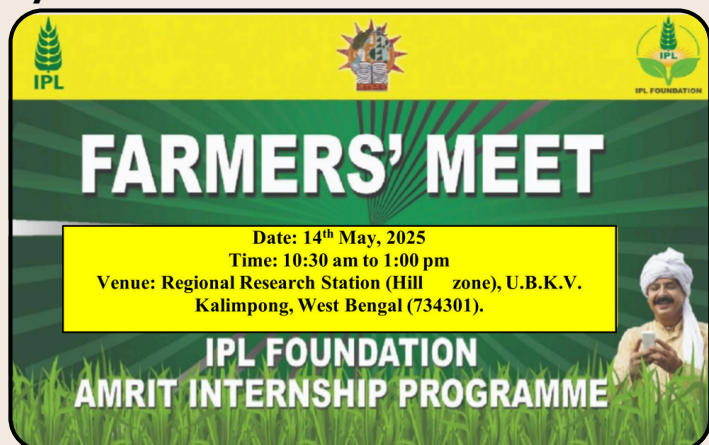

Farmers' Meet at Kalimpong: A Confluence of Knowledge and Insight

On May 14, 2025, the IPL Foundation, in collaboration with U.B.K.V. Kalimpong, hosted a dynamic Farmers' Meet at the Regional Research Station. The event brought together 30 farmers from Kalimpong-I, Pedong, and Gorubathan blocks—previously surveyed by our interns—who shared valuable feedback and expectations from the initiative.

With over 4,200 farmers already engaged through surveys, the meet focused on practical solutions to local agricultural challenges. Experts like Dr. B.R. Sharma and Dr. S. Ali addressed pressing issues such as chirkey and foorkey diseases in large cardamom and rot in ginger crops. Their sessions provided simple, actionable techniques to tackle these problems using integrated disease management. Other key topics included the importance of soil testing, farming mechanization in response to labour shortages, and the potential of horticulture to boost income on small landholdings. A special session also helped interns with their E-Learning modules.



Coordinated by Dr. Biswajit Patra and Dr. Sarad Gurung, the event was a perfect blend of knowledge-sharing and on-ground insight. It turned out to be a valuable learning experience for both farmers and interns, paving the way for more sustainable and productive farming practices.

Amrit Internship Programme Concludes at IPL Sugar Unit, Dhenkanal

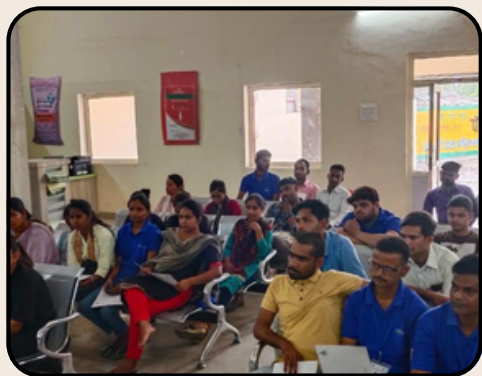


Participation of Amrit Interns during the Ceremony

Success Stories

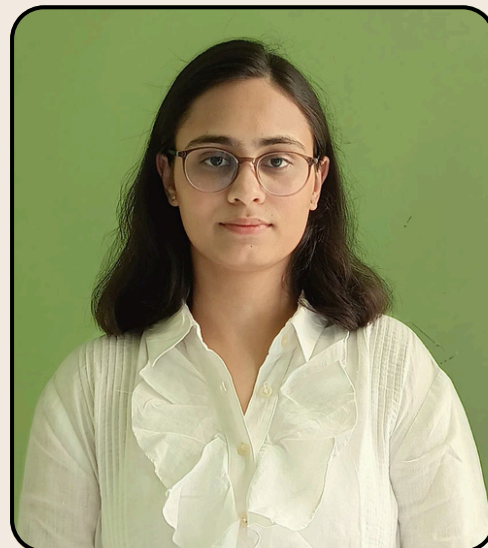

Employees Corner : The Silent Struggle

Of all the things we do in a day, how often do we pause to think about thinking itself ? In a world that is relentlessly fast-paced and competitive, where we seamlessly switch from the mundane—waking up, brushing our teeth—to the complex challenges of our professional lives, our minds rarely linger in the present. Each task, no matter how minor or significant, is often performed on autopilot, dictated by habit rather than conscious reflection. But how often do we immerse ourselves fully in the moment, allowing our minds to engage not just with the action but with the thoughts and emotions it evokes?

Emotions are a natural part of human experience and we often believe that keeping our thoughts and emotions to ourselves is the best way to avoid conflict. But have you ever thought what happens when we suppress our feelings whether its frustration, disappointment, or hurt ? They don't disappear; they simmer beneath the surface, eventually erupting in ways we might not expect or intend. The key is to know when to stay quiet and when to speak, so our emotions don't turn into hidden burdens.

Let's say we know someone named Priya and Raj. Raj has been working in the same office for three years, silently suffering in the "AC War" between his desk mate, Priya, and himself. Priya loves the office feeling like Antarctica, while Raj prefers a normal human temperature. Every morning, she cranks up the AC, and every time she leaves for a coffee break, Raj stealthily turns it down.

But Raj never says anything. Instead, he silently shivers in his sweater, wraps his hands around his tea for warmth, and mutters under his breath. Over time, his quiet suffering turns into deep resentment. He starts blaming Priya for his frequent colds.

Then one day, during a team meeting, someone jokingly asks, "Raj, why do you always look like you're about to climb Mount Everest ?" And just like that, years of bottled-up frustration explode. Raj launches into a dramatic monologue about "The Great AC Crisis". The whole office bursts into laughter, and Priya, confused but amused, finally says, "Wait... why didn't you just tell me ?"

Moral of the story ? *Speak up before you turn workplace struggles into a full-blown, overly dramatic soap opera.*

Not everything needs to be said, but the things that truly matter shouldn't be left unspoken. Silence may seem like a safer choice in the short term and it may feel like an escape, but in reality, it's a slow burning fuse leading to seeds of anger and frustration. **Speak up—not to argue, but to understand and be understood.**
